## CLAY I Don't Want to Move July 29, 2018

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 18:2-6

<sup>22</sup> ...**put off your old self**, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, <sup>23</sup> and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, <sup>24</sup> and to **put on the new self**, **created after the likeness of God** in true righteousness and holiness (Ephesians 4:22–24).

I. We are a Lump of <u>Clay</u>.

But now, O Lord, you are our Father; **we are the clay**, and **you are our potter**; we are all **the work of your hand** (Isaiah 64:8).

then **the LORD God formed the man of dust** from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living creature (Genesis 2:7).

<sup>2</sup> "Arise, and go down to the potter's house, and there I will let you hear my words." <sup>3</sup> So I went down to the potter's house, and there he was working at his wheel. <sup>4</sup> And the vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter's hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as it seemed good to the potter to do. <sup>5</sup> Then the word of the Lord came to me: <sup>6</sup> "O house of Israel, **can I not do with you as this potter has done**? declares the Lord. Behold, **like the clay in the potter's hand, so are you in my hand**, O house of Israel" (Jeremiah 18:2–6).

II. We are Being <u>Molded</u> by Our <u>Father</u>.

<sup>5</sup> And have you forgotten the **exhortation that addresses you as sons**? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. <sup>6</sup> For the Lord **disciplines the one he loves**, and **chastises every son whom he receives**." <sup>7</sup> It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? <sup>8</sup> If you are left without discipline, **in which all have participated**, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. <sup>9</sup> Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more **be subject to the Father** of spirits and live? (Hebrews 12:5–9).

III. We have a <u>Treasure</u> in Vessels of <u>Clay</u>.

<sup>7</sup> But **we have this treasure in jars of clay**, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us. <sup>8</sup> We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; <sup>9</sup> persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; <sup>10</sup> always **carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies**. <sup>11</sup> For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the **life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh** (2 Corinthians 4:7–11).

IV. We are Being <u>Shaped</u> for <u>Another</u> Life

And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you **will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ** (Philippians 1:6).

<sup>6</sup> "...bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the end of the earth, <sup>7</sup> everyone who is called by my name, **whom I created for my glory**, **whom I formed and made**" (Isaiah 43:6–7).
